	based solution which enables importers and exporters
	to electronically appoint and dis-engage customs
	clearing agents of their choice.
	> CAMM can be accessed by both Individuals or
	Companies involved in the importation or exportation
	of goods.
	➤ The CAMM can be accessed on the ZRA website and
	enables importers and exporters to electronically
	appoint and dis-engage Customs Clearing Agents of
	their choice.
What is the legal provision for	➤ Section 184 of CAP 322 of the Laws of Zambia
this?	> It provides an automated form of the "written
	authority" as prescribed under Section 184 of
	Chapter 322 of the Laws of Zambia, which states
	that "Any person making an application to transact
	on behalf of another person should have a written
	authority in a prescribed form"
What is Changing	> The electronic appointment of a clearing agent/s on
	the CAMM will become a mandatory requirement for
	importers and/or exporters to have their goods cleared
	on the Customs system (ASYCUDAWorld)

What happens when an importer/exporter electronically appoints a clearing agent?	The electronic appointment of a clearing agent by an Importers/exporters will allow them to process customs declarations on ASYCUDAWorld through the appointed clearing agents linked to their TPIN.
Is there a limit to how many clearing agents one can appoint?	Importers/exporters can appoint up to ten (10) clearing agents of their choice. Those who wish to appoint more than ten (10) clearing
What are the benefits of CAMM	agents, can write to the office of Assistant Commissioner – Credibility and Controls for consideration. ✓ Mitigating TPIN abuse

How do I ensure TPIN is not abused?	 ✓ Taxpayers are encouraged to ensure correct details are captured and updated on the TPIN profiles so that they receive notifications of any transactions on your TPIN. ** Any unauthorized transactions on the Taxpayer TPIN should be quickly reported to ZRA. ✓ CAMM is aimed at curbing the abuse of TPINs particularly where a TPIN is used to register and clear goods without the consent of the TPIN owner.
Will my TPIN be accessible to clearing agents who I have not electronically appointed to handle my customs clearance business?	No. Only clearing agents appointed by the Taxpayer will have access to the TPIN.

How do I access the CAMM?	To appoint a clearing agent on CAMM, visit the ZRA
	website www.zra.org.zm, select Customs, then
	Click on Customs Portal
	➤ Sign in to your account using the same credentials
	you use for TaxOnline.
	➤ Once successfully signed into the account select
	Customs Licensing
	➤ On the left-hand side under Agent Management click
	on Consignee Requests,
	Click on Appoint Agent(s) to appoint a clearing agent
	of your choice.
	** All appointment requests will have to be
	electronically accepted/ approved by the selected
	clearing agent/s.
	** Where the taxpayer wishes to cease the
	relationship with their appointed agent/s, they can
	electronically disengage the clearing agent/s
